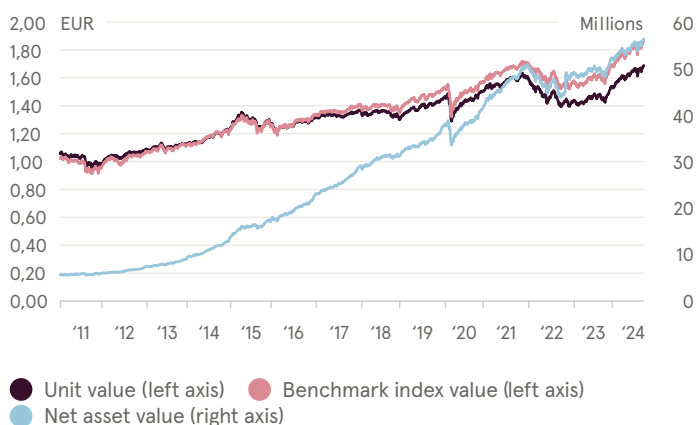
Fund description

It is a medium-risk fund with up to 50% of its assets invested in equity markets. It has a global exposure to equities, with a more stable long-term return compared to sector or regional funds. The remainder (at least 50%) is mainly invested in bonds of investment-grade euro-area governments and corporates, or bond funds. Designed for participants seeking balanced returns and risk. Recommended for 50-58 year olds.

Fund manager's commentary: Developed markets central banks either started or continued to cut interest rates which helped both equities and bonds finish the quarter positively. Equity markets displayed greater volatility due to sharp moves in the Japanese yen and some recession scares, however, the rally got broader – sectors such as utilities, real estate and industrials outperformed the previous leaders in technology and communications. Fixed income outperformed equities with greater belief in slightly faster monetary easing with inflation trending downwards with the global economy still growing. Global aggregate bond index rose by 3,77%, while global equities increased by 2,38%.
